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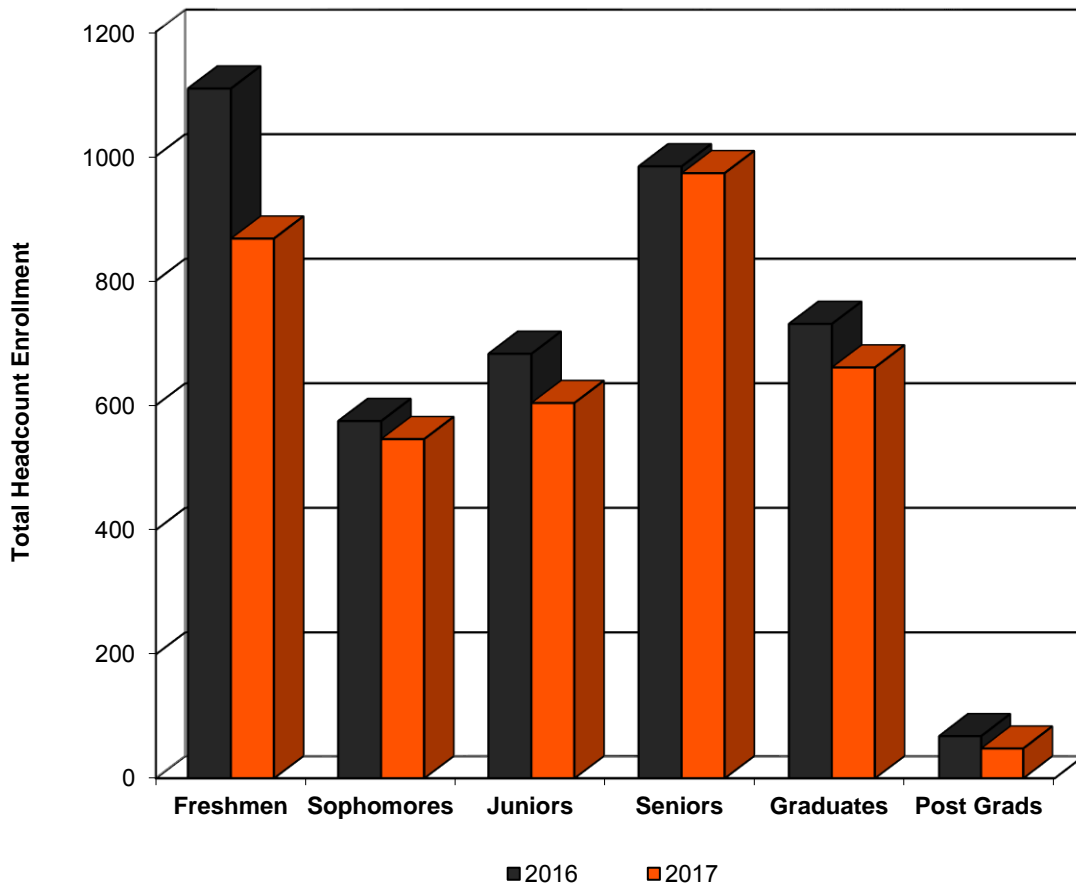

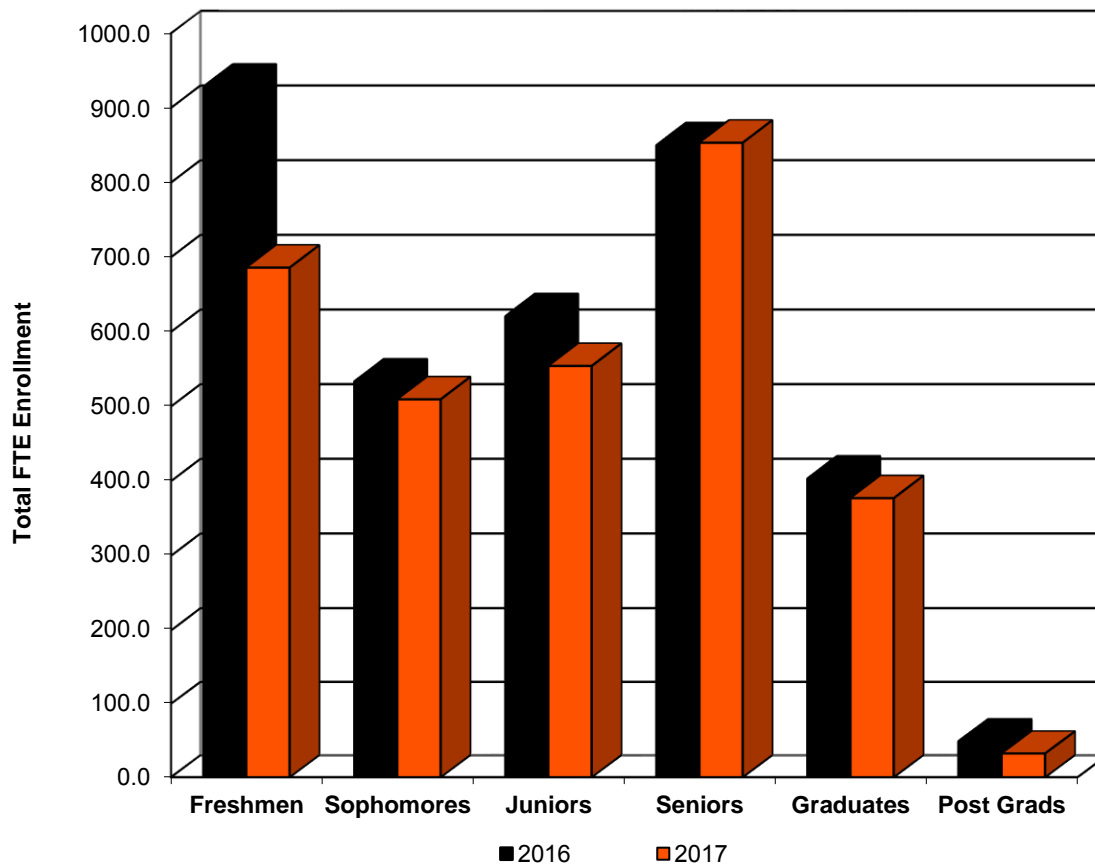

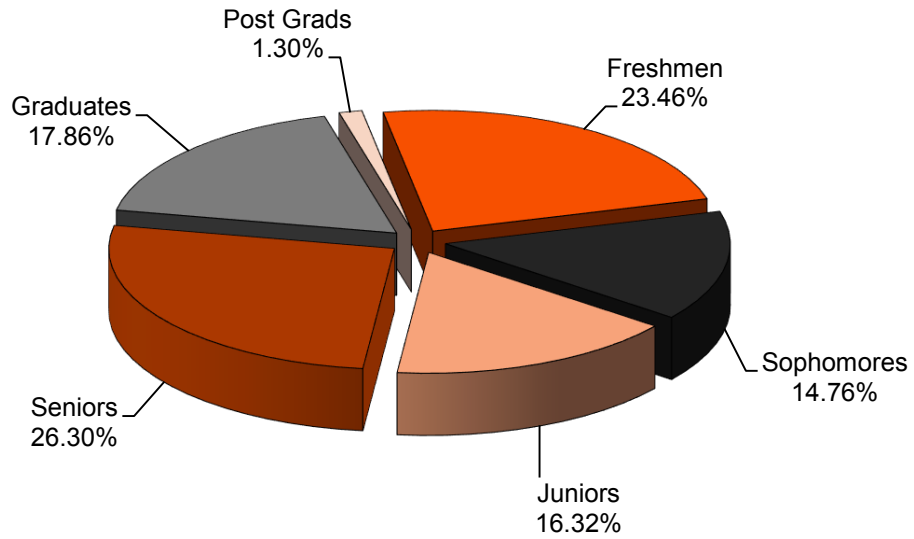

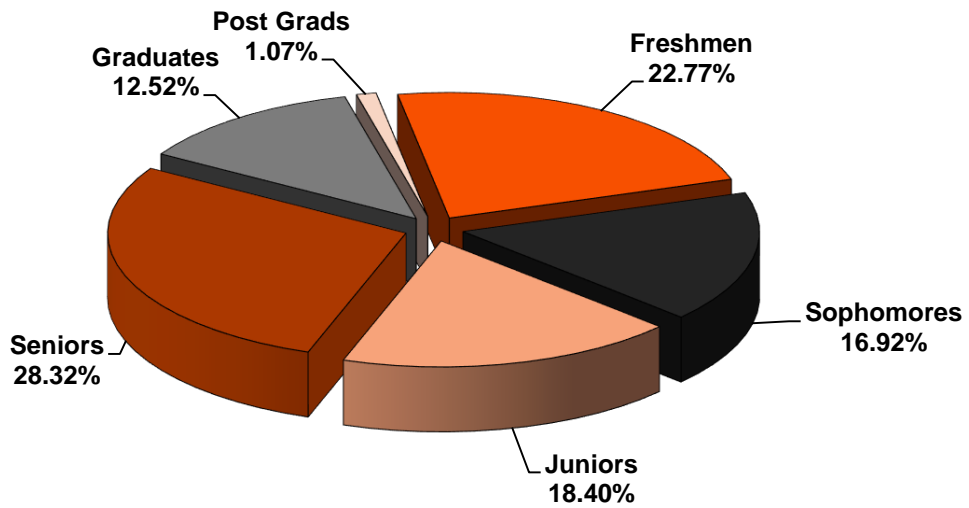


# Spring 2017 Headcount and FTE Enrollment

## Spring 2017 Headcount Enrollment by Classification

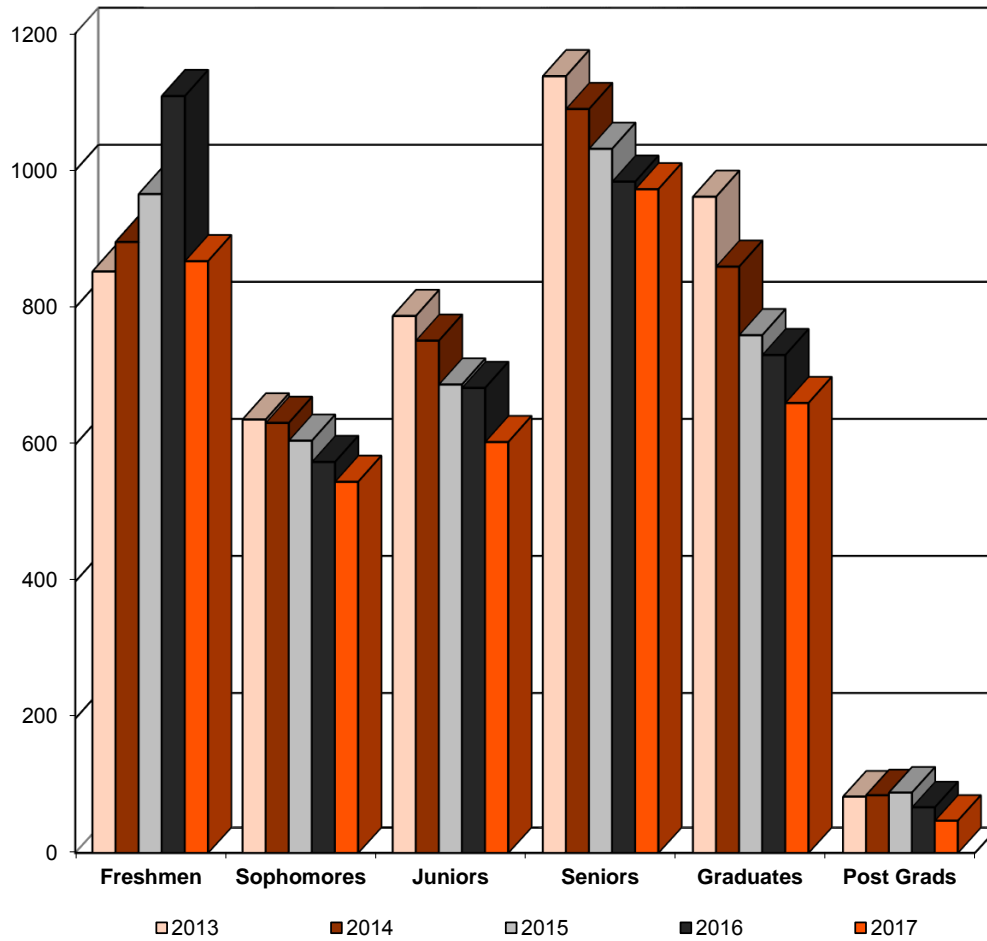


## Spring 2017 FTE Enrollment by Classification

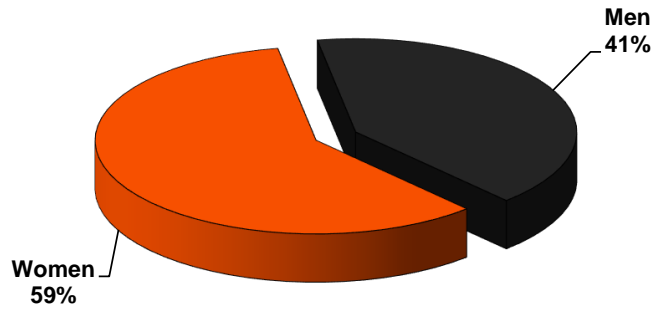

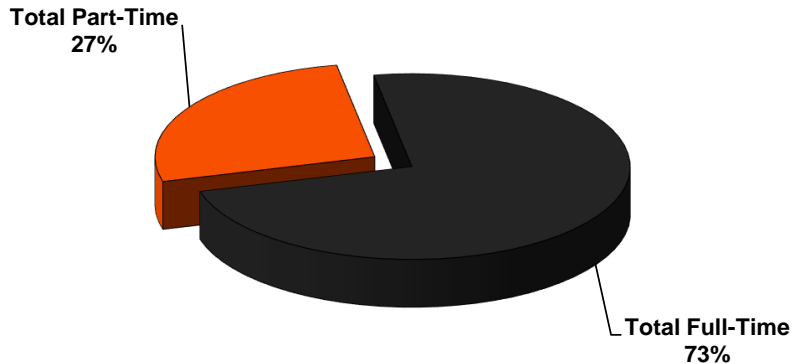

### Spring 2017 Full-Time Enrollment by Sex

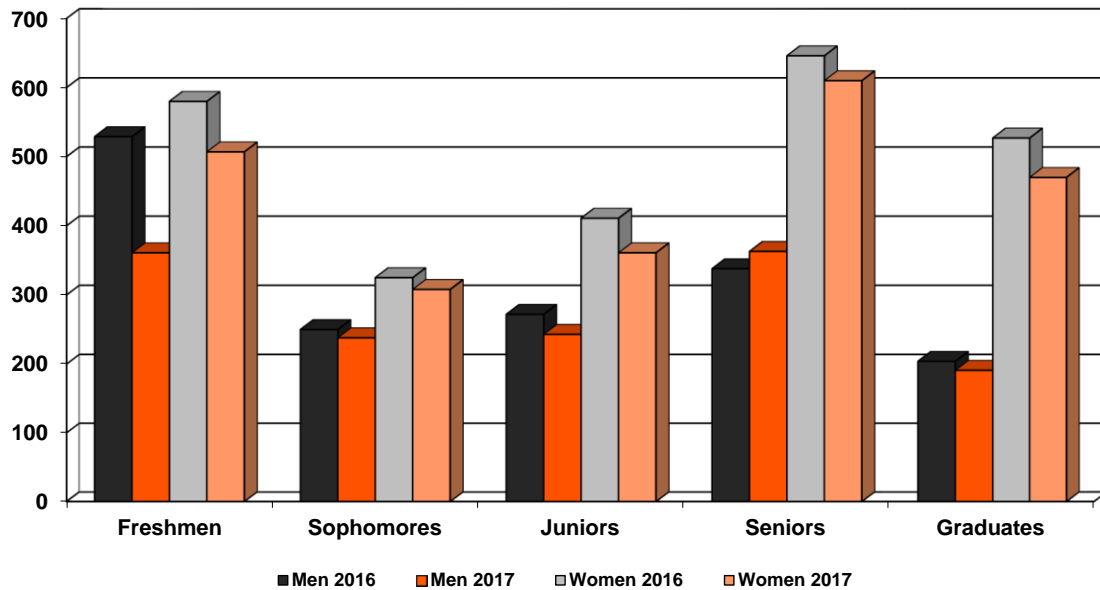


### Spring 2017 Enrollment by Full-Time & Part-Time Status

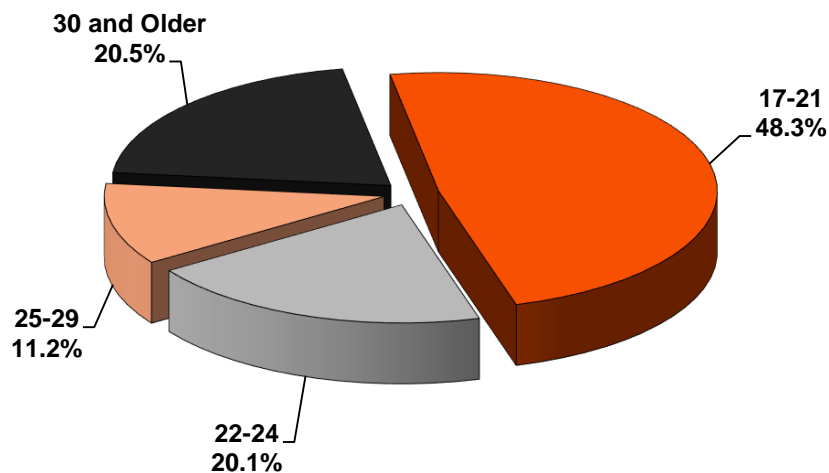

### Spring 2017 Age Distribution Analysis of ECU Students



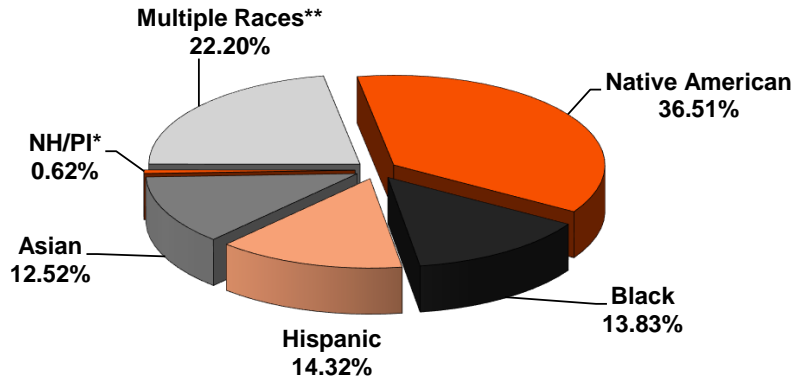

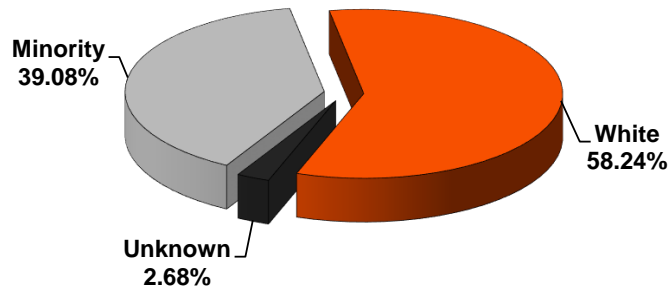

### Minority and White Enrollment



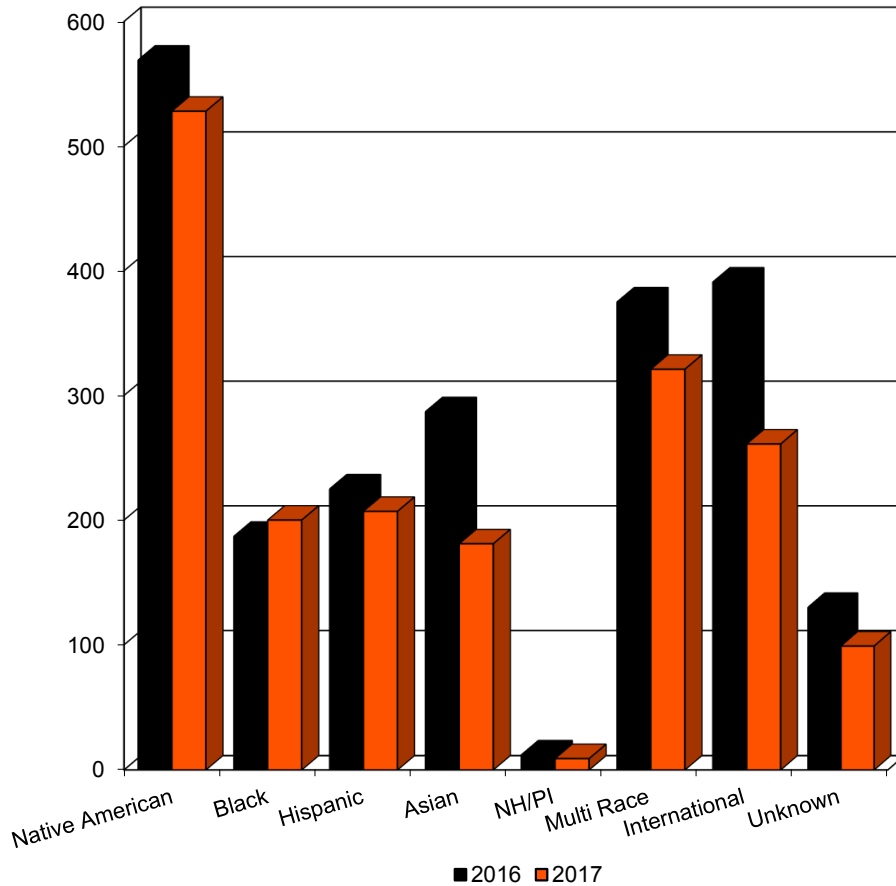

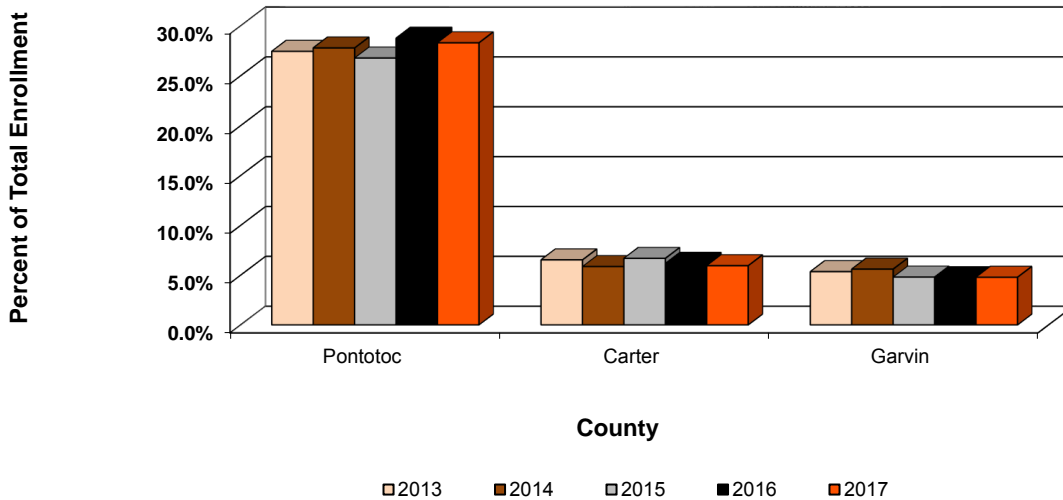

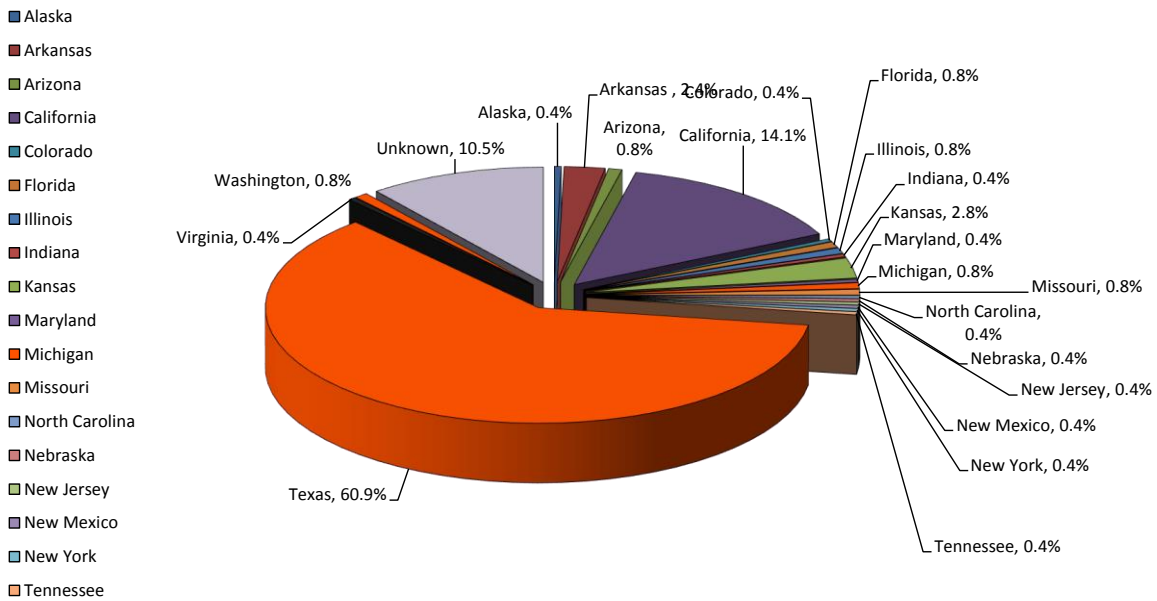

### Distribution of Out-of-State Enrollment

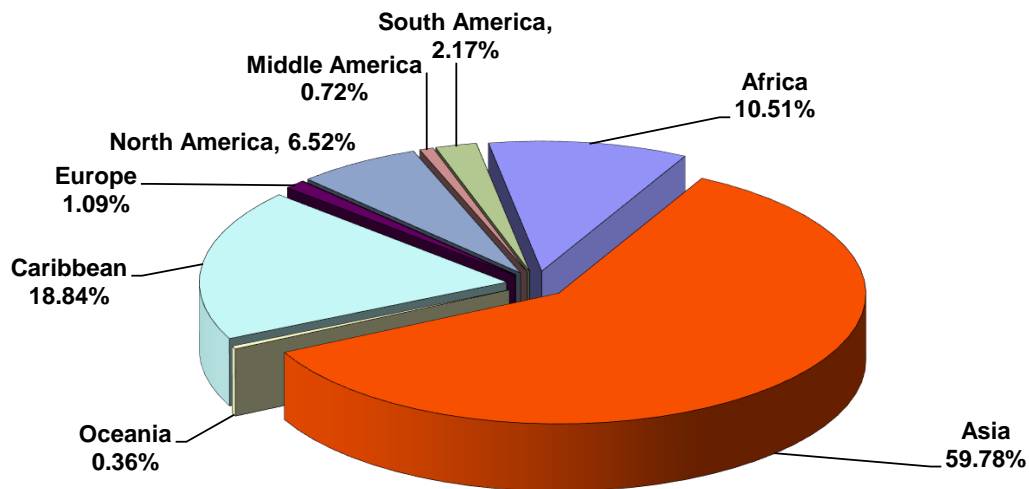

### Spring 2017 International Student Enrollment by Geographic Area





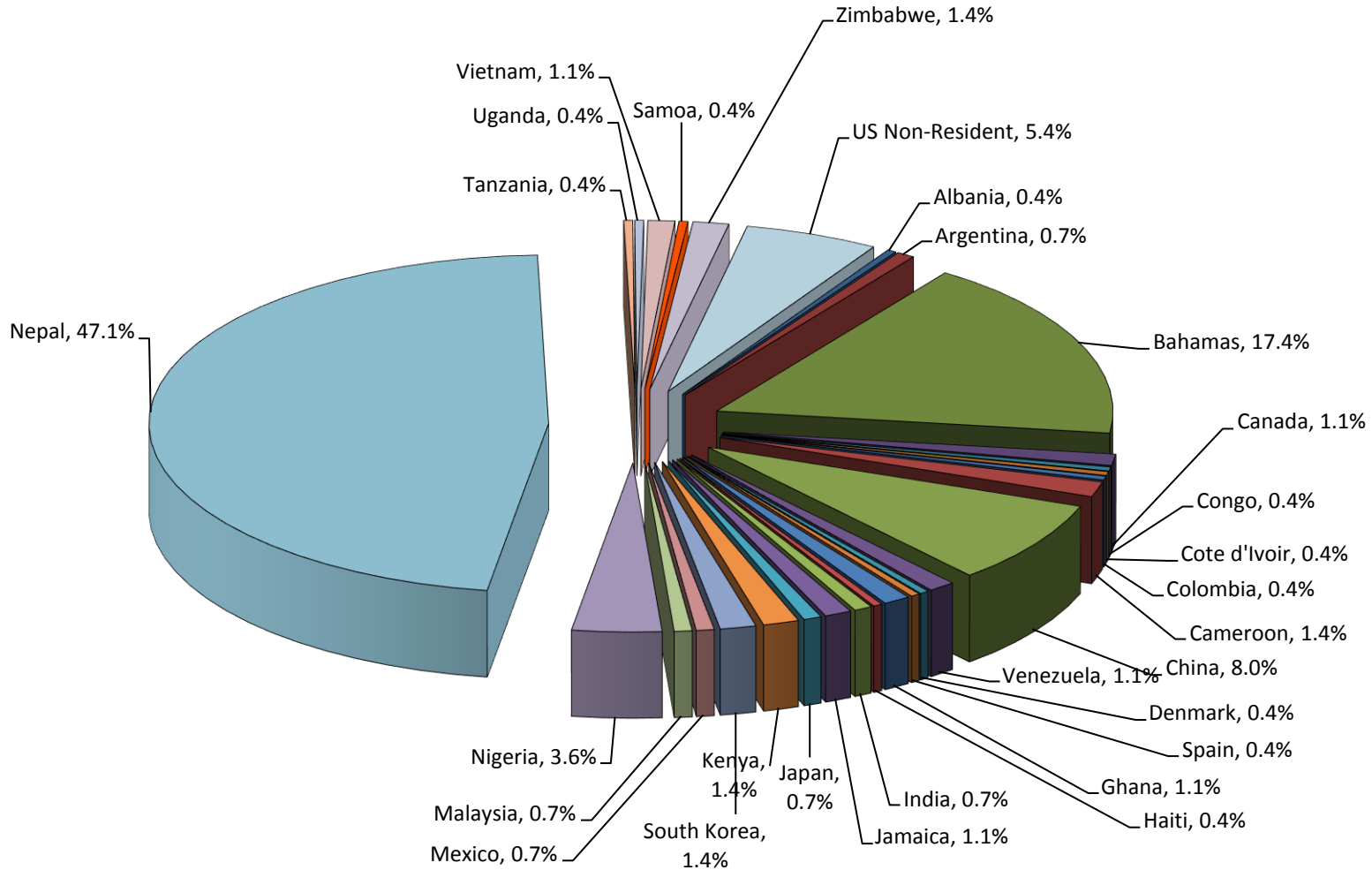
